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
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DRAWN LOCATION PLAN



BOOKSHOP CAFETERIA- ROOF PLAN WITH SHADING





MATERIALS

- 1. CONCRETE GLAZED COLOUMNS: I chose this materials as it links with the façade of my bookshop but also fits the situation of the site and the River Colne. Creating a more durable structure.
- 2. The underground walls and foundation have to be more sensitive to Structural Stability, Durability, Moisture exclusion, Insulation, and Proper Backfilling Method. The walls will be concrete and the walls you can see will have a glazed concrete panels like the Barbara Hepworth building

1. CUSTOMER TOILETS


For the female toilets, I gave them two cubicles with two sinks and a window (The window is covered by the balcony area and facing inwards there for its still private but letting some air and light in), with plenty of areas to move around. I gave them one cubicle, two sinks, and two urinals in the male bathroom. I also have an accessible toilet. I put the customer toilets downstairs on the underground level because it lets customers see the function and exhibition space and the available computer room. There could also be advertisements for events on the corridor down into the toilets. As shown in the visualisation of Figure A.

2. COMPUTER ROOM


I was really passionate about adding a computer room due to my personal experiences with reading and dyslexia, I thought it made the bookshop more diverse. This means that the bookshop can accompany different needs and sell things like audio books and digital books that can be read on the computers. The computer room could also be used for researching books and filling out order forms so the bookshop can order the book you want if they don't have it in stock. Which can then be delivered to the customer from there delivery service which they started in lockdown or for collection from the store. Another reason would be that university students could book the space to use for group projects as the bookshop is really close by to the university, having this room might attract students to come in use the space and look at the books they have to offer.

3. STORAGE ROOM

The storage room is located on the underground floor so that its out of the way of the main bookstore circulation but also close to the function room so they can store equipment in there for events they may hold.








ALTERATIONS THAT I WOULD MAKE POST DESIGN.

- 1. If I had more time on this project there is a couple of changes I would make to my design such as on the underground floor after reflecting on my design I would extend the wall to line up with the edge of the balcony line shown using the red arrows, I would do this it;
 - 1. make sense structurally for the balcony/ outside space
 - 2. Also add extra space for larger storage space and nicer/ more customer toilets
 - 3. would also be beneficial for letting more light in through the window in the computer room.

4. FUNCTION AND EXHIBITION SPACE

The function and exhibition space has a large amount of space and considerate lighting. Taking inspiration from the Barbra Hepworth Museum, I added two large windows with lovely views of the river with a partitioning wall that will spread the natural light around the room. I also want the adjustable spotlights so that the lighting is flexible and can be adjusted per event. 6. BALCONY

The balcony hangs out over the river view with a unique view of down the river. This is a relaxing outdoor space for customers to read and eat and drink any takeaway coffees, and paninis whilst enjoying the relaxing white noise of the flowing River Colne. The balcony is protected from the major wind direction therefor should be sheltered from any major unsettling wind.

The balcony also has the best of the sun through the morning up to about midday. Pot planting placed on the balcony.

BUSHES AND VEGATATION

Places in areas around the bookshop have planting, bushes and plants to also make up for the trees which would have to be removed from the edge of the site to allow for the balcony and bookshop walls down to the river.



4. OFFICE

The office has plenty of sunlight through two windows creating a comfortable ventilation and space to hold a desk Infront of the window and any required storage space for wrapping and packing.

7. DISPLAY WINDOW

A large display window towards the main road facing the main circulation of both traffic and public. The display window will be full of eye-catching advertisements with space to display books with bright lighting.



PROTECTIVE WALL

With inspiration from the Maggie's centre, London, protection from the main roads noise and congestion. It is also protection from the wind direction.

3. ADULT BOOKS

Adult books are placed around area 3 on both curved bookcases and circular tables placed in the centre of each space created from the above pods.

2. ADULT BOOKS (BOOKS IN THE ENTRANCE TRAFFIC)

This space is most important because it will hold the first impressions of the store, due to its entrance circulation. This space will be filled with the best selling books and need to draw customers to follow the circulation pushing them around the store spaces.

1. CHILDRENS BOOKS

The children's books will be in this area, there is also more bookcases in the children's reading area on the 1st floor.

COLUMNS MATERIAL/ AESTHETICS





Figure 2 (Mid-Century Home, 2011). Alvar Alto

The columns on the interior will have a timber finish linking with the natural warm welcoming interior and also mirroring the natural trees opposite the bookshop along the River Colne. This ideas linked with the Alvar Alto Villa Maria, Figure 2 shows the interior columns and how they mirror the forest surrounding using natural finishings.

5. TILLS

I have placed my tills directly in front of the office and wrapping and packing zone so they have easy access straight from the tills to the office. Each till has a moveable wrapping and packing zone. The surface can fold down out the way to allow circulation into the tills.


THE CURVED BOOKCASES:

The curved bookcases follow the pattern of the above floor of the pods. Creating a precise flow of circulation shown in the diagram below. The bookcases will be specially made and will have a timber surface with integrated lighting highlighting the shelves, creating a hierarchy attention to the books.




Figure 3(Pintos, P.P n.d). Maggies Leeds

The reason why I want a timber finish is because it is a smooth warm welcoming material and works really well with the odd artificial plant placed in and around the bookshelves. This type of interior also reminds me off the Maggie's centre in Leeds, figure 3, which I studied for my History assignment.

CIRCLE BOOK TABLES:

There are circle tables places around the areas which can display there best selling books and keep with the curved characteristics.

4. CAFÉ SEATING

Café seating is inside the pods with extra bookcases where they can display more books and brighten the space up with the odd plant. The space holds 18 people with comfortable seating arranged in 2,3 and 4 seater tables. Each table will have a bright colourful light collection over the seating area as inspired from the 93/4 bookshop, brightening up the space for reading. The pods have 3 areas with open roofs the lights will hang from the roof above.

1. CAFÉ COUNTER


The counter holds two tills with a number of cabinets below where they will serve coffees and display sandwiches and snacks. The circulation into the kitchen and café counter is a liftable counter to separate the public from the staff space, highlighted in yellow.

2. KITCHEN

The kitchen holds everything they need so they can have as big or small of a menu whether that's full English breakfasts of just bacon sandwiches and coffees.

3. STAFF ROOM

The staffroom has comfortable ventilation with the window and a kitchenette that includes a microwave, kettle sink and small mini fridge in the Cabinet under the microwave with storage cupboards above. They also have there own staff toilet.



PODS MATERIAL/ ASETHETICS

The pods are to follow the timber interior with smooth curved finishes. The pod windows have been carefully chosen so that they have views continuing to the exterior windows and also interesting interior vies like the café (good for business might tempt more sales) and the children space. This is to open up the space and piece light through the pods. I have demonstrated the views with the yellow lines on my floor plan.

6. STAIRS AND LIFT

The lift is fitted to create easy accessibility through bookstore floc The lift is also needed to transport equipment around the store fi bookshelves and furniture for the exhibition space. The stairs the wrap round the circular lift connecting with the contrast of curved interior against the angular exterior. Adding to the surprise eleme on the 1st floor. The stairs have a glass wall around and also go pa the curved exterior cloudy translucent glass wall, letting light in.


5. CHILDRENS ROOM


The children's rooms is a separate space filled with comfortable seating, beanbags and more children's books. 
LARGE WINDOWS



This physical model was laser cut and superglued together I also used acetate to create the windows. I used this model to then create a detailed visual using procreate after taking a photo and adding features/ context on top.



















This is an abstract view of the 1st-floor view from the top of the stairs and lift. This visual shows the café counter and pods with double-height spaces.


EYE PERSPECTIVE VIEWS






